



# Accommodations

The Maryland Courts provide reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

## Written Request for Accommodation

- The request for an accommodation must be in writing. You can use form [CC-DC-049](#), which can be found at [mdcourts.gov/ada](http://mdcourts.gov/ada).
- You may attach other documents and information that show you require the accommodation.

## Submitting the Request to Court

- Submit your completed form to the courthouse where the hearing or event is scheduled.
- If possible, submit your completed form 30 days before the scheduled hearing or event.

## ADA Coordinator

- Each courthouse in Maryland has an ADA Coordinator. The [list](#) of coordinators can be found at [mdcourts.gov/ada](http://mdcourts.gov/ada).
- The ADA Coordinator will contact you after you submit your request for an accommodation to arrange for an appropriate accommodation.
- You may also reach out to the ADA Coordinator if you need an accommodation for an unscheduled visit to the courthouse.
