In November 2008, he was elected to a 15-year term as the Circuit Court Judge for Talbot County. Judge Earnest was the Managing partner - DLA Piper office, Easton, Maryland from 2007 – 1991. From 1973 – 1991, he was the President of the firm of Earnest & Cowdrey, P.A., Easton, Maryland. He served as Deputy State's Attorney for Talbot County, part time from 1973 – 1975 and as Assistant U.S. Attorney in Washington, D.C. from 1973 – 1968. During his career as an attorney, Judge Earnest participated in over 100 federal and 100 state jury trials in Maryland, D.C., Virginia, Delaware, Massachusetts and California and Florida, as well as approximately 35 appeals in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, and the District of Columbia.
