

**Jay B. Knight** is a licensed attorney and mediator for the Maryland Court of Special Appeals' ADR Division. In that capacity, Jay administers the Court's Pre-Hearing Conference and Mediation Programs. Jay also mediates civil appellate cases, including contract, tort, estate, guardianship, foreclosure, real property, and domestic disputes. Jay came to the Court of Special Appeals from private practice where he specialized in domestic mediation for English- and Spanish-speaking clients and counseled small business clients on securities regulatory practice. For the last fourteen years, Jay has mediated for various circuit courts in Maryland, specializing in child access and domestic/financial property cases.

Prior to his private practice, Jay was the Government Affairs Counsel for the Public Policy and Communications department at the Certified Financial Planner Board of Standards, Inc. (CFP Board), and was a registered lobbyist for CFP Board. Jay was also the Director of the Office of Professional Review at CFP Board, where CFP Board certifies and enforces the certification standards for its members. Jay was a regulatory expert for Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (FINRA) (formerly the National Association of Securities Dealers (NASD) and New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) Regulation). Jay was also the founding Assistant Director of the Division of Examinations at the Securities Bureau for the District of Columbia's Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking, where he enforced District of Columbia's securities laws, conducted investigations of broker-dealers, investment advisers and their employees. He was also previously a staff attorney at the Securities Division in the Office of the Attorney General for the State of Maryland.

Jay received his Bachelor's Degree in English from the State University of New York, College of Fredonia in 1992 where he was President of the Student Government Association, presiding over a half million dollar budget, and was also the recipient of the Joseph T. Gallagher Memorial Scholarship Award for high academic achievement. Later, he earned a J.D. from the University of Maryland, School of Law in 1996 where he was also President of the Student Bar Association and was the recipient of the Henry Zoller, Jr. Scholarship Award.
