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## **Special Project Grants**

The Maryland Judiciary receives state funds each year to support programs that offer services to increase access to justice and enhance the experience of families and children involved with Maryland's legal system. These funds are awarded as Special Project Grants and managed by the Department of Juvenile and Family Services.

## **Grant Purpose**

These grants are being offered to enhance the courts' ability to support a fair, effective, and efficient process for resolving domestic and juvenile matters. The DJFS's Special Projects grant category funds a broad range of program types including, but not limited to: Domestic Violence, Juvenile Justice, Alternative Dispute Resolution, Adult Guardianship and other Domestic Law programs.

#### **Eligible Applicants**

- State and Local Governments within Maryland
- Non-Profit Organizations
- Institutions of Higher Education

Applicants who are seeking funding for a new project that was not previously funded by the DJFS in this grant category must submit a Letter of Intent and be invited to apply. CASA grantees applying in this category must review the eligibility limitations contained in the Special Conditions for FY20 Special Project Grants.

## **Availability and Awards of Funds**

The availability of funds is contingent upon the provision of funds in the Maryland Judiciary budget by the Maryland General Assembly for Fiscal Year 2020. Applicants who are awarded funding will receive notice in June of 2019.

Funding Cycle: July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020

## Special Requirements for NEW Applicants

For applicants who were not funded in this grant category in FY19, a Letter of Intent must be submitted by February 15, 2019 to <a href="DJFSGrants@mdcourts.gov">DJFSGrants@mdcourts.gov</a>. The letters will be reviewed and applicants whose projects are consistent with the priorities of the DJFS will be invited to submit a full application.
