

Clerkships and Internships with Judge Tang Appellate Court of Maryland

CLERKSHIPS

Judge Tang is accepting applications for Term Law Clerks for the 2026 term. Judge Tang is seeking candidates who can begin in August 2026 and commit to serving for two years.

The responsibilities of the law clerk include research, writing, and administrative tasks. Judge Tang is looking for highly motivated, detail-oriented candidates who are strong legal writers and proficient in Westlaw. Successful candidates possess intellectual curiosity about the law and good analytic thinking skills. Candidates with law review or other journal experience are preferred.

Judge Tang's chambers is in the Circuit Court for Montgomery County in Rockville, Maryland, a five-minute walk from the Rockville Metro Station (on the Red Line). Garage parking is available a block away from the circuit court. Law clerks are expected to work in chambers with occasional travel to Annapolis. Judge Tang offers some flexibility with hybrid-remote work.

Candidates must have successfully completed law school and taken the bar exam prior to starting the clerkship. Candidates with prior clerkship and/or litigation experience are encouraged to apply. The interview process will include a short writing exercise and discussion.

SUMMER INTERNSHIPS

Judge Tang welcomes interns over the summer. These are unpaid or for-credit positions that allow students a first-hand opportunity to see and participate in the work of the Appellate Court. The location of chambers in the circuit court also provides opportunities to observe trial court proceedings. Interns are hired on a rolling basis.
