ORDER

By the Court's March 24, 2016 Order, attorney Mark D. Monson (AIS No. 0512140282) was prohibited from the further practice of law in the State of Maryland for failure to comply with the obligations imposed by Rule 19-605. Attorney Monson has now requested reinstatement pursuant to Rule 19-606(c), and the Trustees of the Client Protection Fund have confirmed attorney Monson's compliance with Rule 19-605.

By the Court's April 1, 2001 Order, attorney John Richard R. Tormey (AIS No. 9612190221) was prohibited from the further practice of law in the State of Maryland for failure to comply with the obligations imposed by Rule 19-605. Attorney Tormey has now requested reinstatement pursuant to Rule 19-606(c), and the Trustees of the Client Protection Fund have confirmed attorney Tormey's compliance with Rule 19-605.

Accordingly, it is this 8th day of April 2026, by the Supreme Court of Maryland,

ORDERED that attorneys:

Mark D. Monson (AIS No.0512140282), and

John Richard R. Tormey (AIS No.9612190221)

are restored to good standing by the Court and are again permitted to practice law in the State of Maryland; and it is further

ORDERED that the Clerk of this Court shall send notice in accordance with Rule 19-761.
