

- (2)The terms of commissioners are staggered as required by the terms in 2 effect for commissioners on [October 1, 1998] JULY 1 APRIL 10, 2006.
- At the end of a term, a commissioner continues to serve until a 4 successor qualifies.
- A commissioner who is appointed after a term has begun serves for 6 the rest of the term and until a successor qualifies.
- Before taking office, each appointee to the Commission shall take the oath 8 required by Article I, § 9 of the Maryland Constitution.
- The Governor may remove a commissioner for incompetence or misconduct 10 in accordance with § 3-307 of the State Government Article.

- 2 (a) (1) The Office of People's Counsel shall evaluate each matter pending 3 before the Commission to determine if the interests of residential and noncommercial
- 4 users are affected.
- 5 (2) If the Office of People's Counsel considers the interest of residential
- 6 and noncommercial users to be affected, the Office of People's Counsel shall appear
- 7 before the Commission and courts on behalf of residential and noncommercial users
- 8 in each matter or proceeding over which the Commission has original jurisdiction,

- 18 commissioner of the Public Service Commission serving on the effective date of this
- 19 Act shall terminate at the end of June 30 April 9, 2006. The terms of office of each of
- 20 the commissioners of the Public Service Commission appointed under Section 1 of this
- 21 Act shall begin on July 1 April 10, 2006, and shall expire as follows:
- 22 (1) ene the member appointed by the Governor in 2007;
- (2) the one member appointed by the Attorney General Speaker of the

- 8 this Act, nothing in this Act shall be construed to affect the funding, employees, or
- 9 property of the Office of People's Counsel.

- 11 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health
- 12 or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the
- 13 members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take
- 14 effect from the date it is enacted.
