ORDER

On September 28, 2022, the applicant, Young Lee, representative for the family of Hae Min Lee, filed a request to appeal the Circuit Court for Baltimore City’s order granting the “State’s Motion to Vacate Judgment of Conviction.” Upon receipt of this notice of appeal, the Clerk docketed the appeal as No. 1291, September Term 2022. Appellate review of the circuit court’s order is obtained by filing an application for leave to appeal that “contain[s] a concise statement of the reasons why the judgment should be reversed or modified” and “specif[ies] the errors allegedly committed by the lower court,” Md. Rule 8-204(b)(3). Applicant’s notice lacks these requirements. Accordingly, it is this 29th day of September 2022, by the Court of Special Appeals, on its own initiative,

ORDERED that No. 1291, September Term 2022, is administratively closed; and it is further

ORDERED that this case shall proceed as an application for leave to appeal in No. 1292, September Term 2022; and it is further

ORDERED that, within 15 days of the date of this Order, applicant shall file a supplemental application for leave to appeal in compliance with Md. Rule 8-204(b)(3); and it is further

ORDERED that, within 15 days after the applicant files the supplemental application for leave to appeal, the respondent State of Maryland and respondent Adnan Syed shall file a response.
